

How did the experience of the First Crusade shape the experience of the second crusade for the participants (willing or unwilling?)

Questions	Answers
<p>Do you have at least one hypothesis to guide your research? Which hypothesis or hypotheses are you going to follow up on?</p>	
<p>What points do you need to make in support of your hypothesis or hypotheses?</p>	
<p>What evidence do you still need to gather? Who will gather it?</p>	
<p>What problems need to be resolved? (Are there materials you don't understand? Is everyone clear on what he or she is to do?)</p>	
<p>What tasks do members of the group need to do for the next week and who should do them?</p>	

Required Step for Today:

Fill in one copy of the reverse side and hand it in.

Suggested Steps for Today:

1. Review your group's wiki. Who hasn't made a contribution yet? What contribution should that person (or those people make)? Remember, in order to get credit for the project, each member of the group will have to contribute to the wiki.
2. Do a concept map for each of your group's hypotheses. You may not have specific evidence to support the hypothesis, but you should be able to identify the topics you would need to discuss to support your hypotheses. Decide which of your hypotheses seem most promising at this point.
2. Assign members of the group to gather the evidence on each of the topics for the "live" hypotheses. You may find the questions on Tuesday's handout useful as a way of thinking about some topics you might end up covering.
3. Assign one or more people in the group to post the group's decisions on the wiki by the weekend.

Tasks for this week

1. You will need to post most of the evidence you'll use in your paper on the wiki this week, as you'll want to start writing by the end of next week. Remember to indicate page numbers and sources (parenthetically) on the wiki. That way you won't have to go searching through the reading for the citation when you're writing the paper. Continue to insert information under your own name. You may not take anything off the wiki page yet (next week).
2. It would be a good idea to begin reading ahead for information on the second crusade.
3. Check the wiki toward the end of the weekend and gently remind group members who need a reminder that they need to contribute.
4. Monday evening, take a look at the wiki. What does it still need? Bring your ideas to class to share with your group. You will have about a half hour next Thursday to assign writing roles.
